> Hq. 115th Cav. Gp. (Mecz) APO 408, U. S. Army 29 May 1945

- 1. The 115th Cav. Gp. (Mecz) continued the mission of protecting the left flank of the 103d Infantry Division from 1 May 45 to 2 May 45 inclusive. Attached units were 69th AFA Bn. and 107th Cav. Rcn. Sq. Group CP was at Krunn, Germany.
- 2. The Group was relieved from attachment to 103 Infantry Division on 3 May 1945 and attached to 35th AAA Brigade. The mission was changed this date to securing and policing the VI Corps rear area. The 20th Armd. Inf. Bn, was attached 3 May 45. The 69th AFA Bn was released from attachment 3 May 45. Group CP was located at Fussen, Germany 3, 4, and 5 May.
- 3. Mission and attachment continued the same from 6 May to 10 May 45 incl. Group CP was located at Nesselwang, Germany, during this period. The 533 AAA En was attached on 6 May 45 and the 895th AAA En was attached on 7 May 45.
  - 4. The following data is submitted for period 1 May 10 May 45 inclusive:
    - a) No casualties were suffered.
    - b) No prisoners of war were taken.
    - c) There were no Own or Enemy material losses.

- 1. The 107th Cav Ron Sq (- Trp A detached) continued the mission of protecting the 103rd Inf Div left (East) flank from SCHONGAU southeast to ESCHEN by reducing enemy resistance and patroling west to the general line MOOSEGG PEISSENBERG UFFING ESCHEN until 011430. The Squadron (- Trp A dtchd) protected the Division left flank with defensive positions at WALLGAU and SCHARNITZ, and by patroling road from D665715 to D698700, from 011430 to 031200. No lesses were sustained.
- 2. The Squadron (- Troop A detached) was engaged in the security of the general area of SCHONGAU KAUFBEUREN FUSSEN SAULGRUB from 031245 to 050930, and the general area MARKT OBERDORF KEMPTON WERTACH FUSSEN (all exclusive) from 050930 to 102400. Ren patrols patroled the Corps MSR twice daily and the main and secondary road nets once daily. Searching parties cleared the area of enemy troops and arms. 264 prisoners were taken, the Squadron did not engage in combat action during this period and no losses were sustained.
